Plant Sale Next Week At St. Bede's

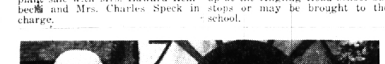
LATHRUP — The sanctuary society of St. Bede church is having its annual plant sale on May 26 from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m.
