Like Books, Library Opens New Doors

They're now open—the new doors to Baldwin Public Library opened officially last week, giving the public its first look at the addition, where the new main desk is now being used for all charging and discharging of adult books.

Miss Jeanne Lloyd, librarian, reports that, "we still have only one toe in the new wing," since last summer's lengthy steel strike has delayed the installation of all the new shelving until late May.

"NEVERTHELESS, the new entrance will now be used by all library users except children, who will use the Chester street entrance while their department is temporarily housed in the storyland above.

In discussing the opening of the new entrance and the inauguration of the new charging desks, the librarian noted the helpful and cooperative attitude with which patrons and staff are meeting the inconveniences caused by the building remodeling.

In the Boys' and Girls' temporary Storyland Alcove headquarters, for example, the staff has had to tackle the problem of fitting the

IN THE reference department, whose furniture has had to be shifted around and almost under the patrons sitting at tables, the patrons take it with a laugh, she said even offering to help as furniture movers.

To clear the way for use of the new main entrance, many shelves of heavy books had to be relocated. Staffers reported cheerful public acceptance of these unavoidable shifts, of the temporary unavailability of magazines, as well as the less than perfect reading conditions.

SANDWICHING in routine work with packing efforts has challenged the ingenuity of order and catalog staff. Now, with moving day over for them, they're busily engaged "breaking in" their new locations.

The remodeling phase of the project now begun is expected to be completed by July 4.

"As for the interim, the staff knows the understanding so typical of Baldwin Library borrowers will minimize difficulties and that eventual spaciousness will be well worth all the current confusion," Miss Lloyd said.
