Michigan, 1955, provides as follows:

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan Under the provisions of Act 209, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with City and Township Clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the Clerk's office is open for registration.
