Safe Taken From Office At Eccentric

A 300-pound safe, containing a variety of personal papers, and a Polaroid camera were taken early Monday from the publisher's office at The Birmingham Eccentric, 1222 Bowers, Birmingham.

Burglars gained entrance to the new building by forcing open a side door. The thieves also attempted to open a safe in another office, but were unsuccessful. Nothing else was taken.

The break-in was discovered at 6 am Monday by Henry Caura of Royal Oak, maintenance worker. He summoned George R. Averill, publisher, who called police.

Det. Lt. Merlin Holmquist said a patrol car had checked the building late Sunday night and the burglary must have occurred early the next morning.

"THIS SAFE contained not a single dollar's worth of U.S. currency or negotiable securities," Averill said.

"Its contents consisted of numerous personal tax statistics, cancelled checks, bank deposit slips, plus an assortment of personal memorandums of value only to myself."

"I am hopeful," he continued, "that those who removed the safe will, when they find its contents of no value to them, arrange in some manner to have them returned."

AVERRILL SAID that due to the nature of the newspaper-printing business, very little cash accumulates in the offices.

"Practically 98 per cent of our total transactions are handled by checks. Even our own payroll has always been paid out by checks," he said.

Sister Kenny Therapy Center To Be Dedicated

Portia general hospital and the Sister Elizabeth Kenny foundation will formally dedicate their new cooperative facility, the Sister Elizabeth Kenny physical therapy department, on Sunday, according to a joint announcement issued by Harold B. Zuler, hospital administrator, and E. J. Rollings, executive vice president of the foundation.

Brief ceremonies and an open house from 2 to 4 p.m. will enable visitors to inspect the therapy unit on the first floor of the hospital's east wing.

The center provides the hospital with its first fully equipped physical therapy department and permits referral of patients by hospital staff doctors. The foundation may likewise refer patients to the hospital for treatment, thereby increasing Kenny inpatient and outpatient facilities, and broadening inpatient care of acute polio, which to date has been inadequate.

ONE of the prime functions of the new department is the rehabilitation of persons of all ages with nerve, muscle or joint disabilities.

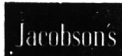
