

# GOP Chairman Defends School Essay Contest

Oakland county GOP chairman Arthur G. Elliott, Jr., has accused his Democrat counterpart of "intentionally distorting" the facts of a GOP-sponsored high school essay contest and "intimidating" school officials.

Elliott referred to a Republican essay, poster and slogan contest on the theme "Why Nixon and Lodge are best for America." The Oakland county Republican committee sponsored the contest in connection with Henry Cabot Lodge's appearance in the county Oct. 24.

Winners received a letter of commendation and a desk pen set from Lodge and a chance to be campaigning for a day with U.S. Congressman William S. Brownfield.

the contest and asked to notify their students.

"The contest was in no way connected with the public schools," Elliott said.

"The schools were simply requested to inform students that such a contest was being held," Elliott said.

Elliott said James Ginn, Democrat county chairman, protested to the schools, with the result that school officials, in an effort to avoid a political feud, advised students not to participate in the contest.

Ginn's letter said that under the similar provision was made for the situation to express their preference for the Democratic national ticket, school authorities should "take immediate steps to remedy the situation."

"An improper use of the public schools."

Elliott replied:

"I'm sure Mr. Ginn did not expect the Republican party to sponsor an essay contest for the Democrat national ticket; Mr. Ginn and the Democrat party were quite free to conduct their own contest.

"And to inform students that such a contest was being held could hardly be construed as an improper use of the public schools.

"It is unfortunate that Mr. Ginn chose to use the influence of his office to attempt to intimidate school officials.

"The result has been that Mr. Ginn's ill-considered action has caused the contest winners and school officials serious embarrassment. I feel that Mr. Ginn and the Democrat party owe the public schools and the entire community an apology," Elliott concluded.

## Winter Increases Traffic Hazards, State Police Say

With November and December averaging a fifth of the annual Michigan traffic deaths, Sgt. Mike Ahlgrim of the Pontiac State Police post is warning motorists and pedestrians to be unusually vigilant in these hazardous months.

The toll for last November and December was 295, or 20 per cent of the 1959 total, the same as the 35-year average computed since traffic records were begun.

**MORE HOURS** of darkness due to shorter days mean more driving and walking is done in reduced visibility, Sgt. Ahlgrim pointed out.

Frequent unfavorable weather and road conditions increase the hazards. In addition, holiday shopping adds to the volume of pedestrian and vehicle traffic in these two months.

**"MORE ALERT** driving and walking can cut down this year and toll," Sergeant Ahlgrim emphasized. "To increase their safety, motorists and pedestrians must work at it every day. You can't take safety for granted."
