Artist to Play At Cranbrook

The Cranbrook Music Guild announce the appearance of Jean Casadesus at Cranbrook House on Nov. 16. The original date of the concert was changed to allow for Mr. Casadesus' appearance with the London Philharmonic the preceding week.

The conductor for his appearance with the Philharmonia will be Constanтин Silvestri, world famous Roumanian conductor. This is the same London Philharmonia that toured the United States in the early 1950's under the direction of Herbert von Karajan.

CASADESUS was born in Paris in 1927 and studied at the Paris conservatory in addition to work with various members of his famous family. He moved to the U.S. with his family in 1949 and made his debut as soloist under Eugene Ormandy in March, 1947.

He has played with many of the most famous orchestras in America and abroad. His appearance at Cranbrook is one of the musical highlights of the season for the Detroit area.

HIS PROGRAM will be Tocatta and Fugue in E Minor by J. S. Bach; Variations and Fugue on a Theme of Handel, Opus 24, Brahms; Six preludes by Debussy; Sonata #2 by Prokofiev.
