## Right-of-Way, Follow Too Close Accident Causes

"Right-of-Way" and "following too closely" violations again led the list of reasons for traffic accidents during September, according to Birmingham Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley.

Traffic accidents in September showed a slight improvement over September, 1959, he said. There was, however, a substantial increase in accidents over August of this year, he added.

Total accidents in September were 56 including 40 property damage and 16 personal injury accidents. Nineteen persons were injured. There were no fatalities.

"WITH EARLY darkness and icy streets, drivers at this time of year can be extremely dangerous," Moxley stated, unless the driver is constantly on the alert.

## Did You Know It? 7 Political Parties Were on Ballots

Farrell Dobbs, Eric Hass, Lar Daly and Rutherford Decker are forgotten men in the race for President of the United States.

Michigan Secretary of State James M. Hare points out that these are the little-known third party candidates whose names were on voting machines and on paper ballots in the general election Tuesday.

"For the first time in many years we again had seven political parties on the ballot," Hare said.

"In 1956 the only third party on the ticket was the Prohibition Party. Its candidate, Enoch A. Hotvick, polled 6,923 Michigan votes compared to 1,359,898 for Adlai Stevenson and 1,719,647 for Dwight D. Eisenhower."

BESIDES THE Nixon-Lodge and Kennedy-Johnson tickets voters had the choice of Farrell Dobbs and Myra Tanner Weiss on the Socialist Workers' ticket, Eric Hass and Georgia Constanti on the Socialist Labor ticket, Lar Daly and B. Millen on the Tax Cut ticket, and Rutherford L. Decker and E. Harold Munn, Sr., on the Prohibition ticket.

The Independent American Party did not show candidates for President and Vice-President.
