

B'field Cracks Down On Woodward Racers

Bloomfield Hills is cracking down on teenagers who use Woodward avenue as a drag strip. According to Justice of the Peace Alva J. Richardson, who was recently forced off the road himself, racing down Woodward is becoming a common occurrence.

"I've fined some boys as much as \$100 and if that doesn't do the

trick I might add a few days in jail," he said.

Latest violators were Ronald F. Stacey, 19, and his brother, Raymond W., 17, 5890 Orchard Road, Birmingham, who were arraigned in Bloomfield Hills Monday morning before Justice Richardson and fined \$25 apiece.

The brothers were picked up at 2:15 a.m. Sunday and charged with reckless driving for racing each other down Woodward at speeds of 75 miles per hour.

It was Raymond's first offense but Ronald has had several other traffic violations, police said, and faces possible loss of his driver's license.

"Ronald has had enough offenses to put him over the 12-point limit," said City Clerk Robert Stadler.

Americans to Use 64 Billion Gallons Of Fuel, Bureau Says

The U. S. bureau of public roads reports Americans will burn nearly 64 billion gallons of motor fuel this year—most of it gasoline.

The report said the average Michigan resident will use 776 gallons of gasoline this year which will cost him about \$250 of which \$77 will be taxes—six cents for each gallon to the state and four cents to the federal government.

The typical Michigan resident will contribute a total of \$46.20 to the roads and streets in Michigan this year.

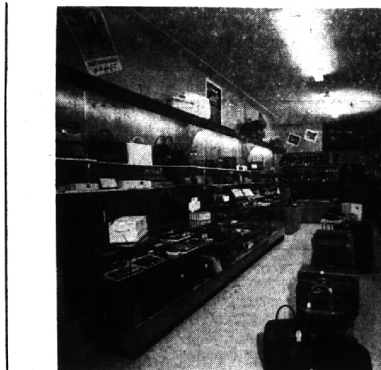

Eight Local JA Firms Begin Production

Birmingham's eight miniature Junior achievement business concerns are manufacturing the first in a line of plastic, wood and steel products which will be rolling off production lines in ever increasing numbers in the weeks ahead.

It is estimated that the small-time companies will hit their production stride within two or three weeks.

JA's eight-month program of economic education started on Oct. 10. Since then 301 JA companies in southeastern Michigan and 4000 throughout the nation have given boys and girls between 15 and 19 the opportunity to learn all phases of business, through the operation of their miniature businesses.

Although no official figures are known yet, it is estimated that an all-time high has been set in the sale of JA company stock in southeastern Michigan this year. Last year, over 38,000 individuals bought \$36,480.50 worth of the 50-cent stock in the area.

CURRENT ESTIMATES place the number of local JA companies actually selling their wares now at 25 per cent. The remainder are still working out assembly line problems or are being delayed by inavailability of raw materials.

Most of the companies will rely heavily on door-to-door sales while a few are striving for wholesale orders.

Each JA company is counselled by an adult enterprise which provides an advisory team of three advisers for guidance in business, sales and production matters.

Eight thousand young people are now active in JA in southeastern Michigan's six-county area.
