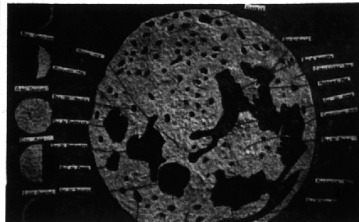


**B'ham Students In A-Cappella Choir**

**Student Teaching In Kalamazoo**

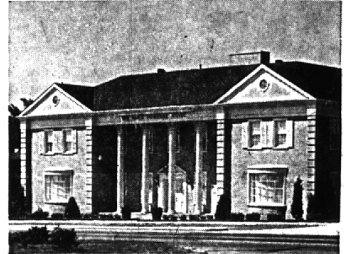
More than 200 senior students in the school of education, Western Michigan university, are busy this fall with student teaching assignments on the campus and throughout Southwestern Michigan.

When the curtain went up on William Shakespeare's "Measure for Measure" at the University of Detroit Repertory theatre last week four local residents were working on the play.

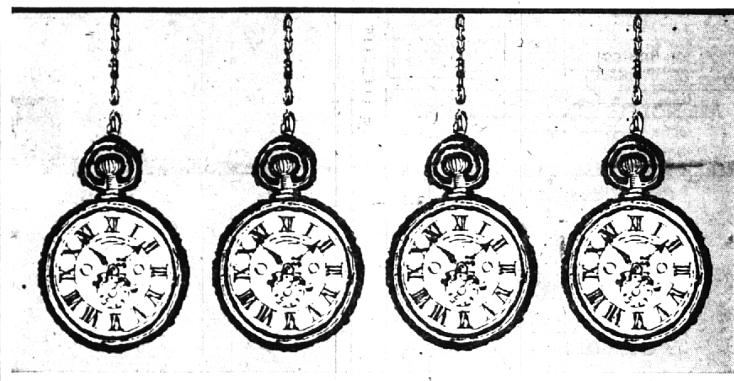
