

Medical Mirror

WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

Auto Seat Belts

- Eye Pain
- Breast Surgery

Q. What is the medical view regarding auto seat belts?

A. Based on information gathered by the automotive crash injury research program conducted at Cornell University, about 5,000 lives could have been saved in the U.S. by use of seat belts during 1947. During the past year, the Public Health Service joined hands with the National Safety Council and the American Medical Association in a campaign to educate the public with respect to the value of such belts and to encourage their widespread use. Results of the educational program, so far, have been discouraging.


Q. I occasionally have a shooting pain in my left eye. What causes this?

A. This seems to happen in normal persons, and for no known reason. It may be a bit more frequent in highstrung individuals and is often only one of many minor complaints.

Q. Is there any way to get rid of swelling in the hand and arm after breast surgery? Lots of women would like to know about this.

A. Removal of the breast is not a simple operation. The surgeon may have to remove much underlying tissue and the arm is usually sore and stiff. In addition, the arm may swell and it may take several months for the swelling to go down. Patients are encouraged to keep using the arm. Baby it too much and recovery will be unduly prolonged. Doctors often recommend exercise and the use of elastic strapping of the arm to help overcome this condition.
