**Southfield Man Admits Robbery Of RO Motel**

**SOUTHFIELD** — A 23-year-old Southfield man, arrested last week by Royal Oak police, admitted robbing a Royal Oak motel of \$50 Nov. 5.

The man, Robert C. Cottee, a resident of Fens Lake trailer park at 30000 Southfield road, was charged with armed robbery and waived examination before Municipal Judge Keith J. Loenhouts of Royal Oak. He was held under \$5,000 bond, pending circuit court arraignment Monday.

Robert Van Henzl, a private guard employed by the Big town drive-in, in Royal Oak recognized Cottee from a description, while the Southfield man was sitting in his car. Royal Oak police arrested him a few minutes later.

VAN HENZL told police he noticed Cottee "flashing a gun" around the drive-in.

In conversation with a police officer the day before, the bandit driver in the motel office at 2400 N. Woodward. She said he wore a white trench coat and a woman's silk stocking over his head.

The gunman then forced her into a shower room at gunpoint and fled. Royal Oak detectives clued Cottee of another robbery at the same motel Sept. 28 after questioning him.

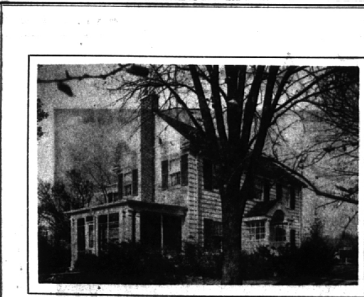

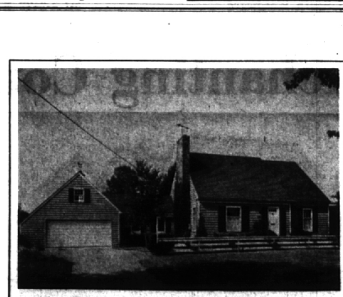

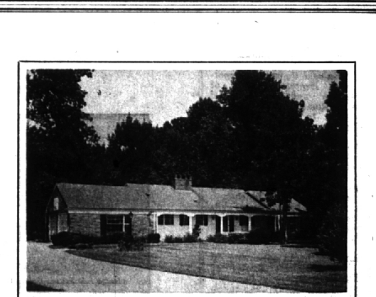
