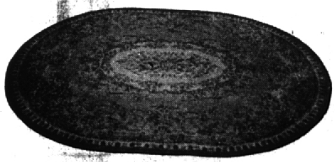

S'field to Hold Second Meeting On Junior Highs

SOUTHFIELD—The second of two meetings to discuss proposed improvements for future planning at the junior high school level in the Southfield school system will be held tomorrow at 8 p.m. at the high school.

At the earlier meeting, Nov. 4, a resume of needs and requirements at the junior high level was presented by three speakers. School administrators, board members, several school principals and department heads, as well as 25 interested parents.

The meetings are a result of recent discussions on the junior high school program in the local system.

GLENN SCHOENHALS, superintendent of schools, said the board is considering four junior high schools, one in each corner of the district. There are now two.

The report on junior high schools by James B. Conant, president emeritus of Harvard university, was scheduled for discussion at the first meeting.

Conant's recommendations, in part, include required subjects for seventh and eighth graders and block time—setting aside time for one teacher to conduct classes with the same pupils for two or more periods.

He also suggests departmentalization or specialist teachers in each subject matter and he approves use of new developments in mathematics and foreign languages.
