**Franklin's Hunter's Whip Buys Property**

FRANKLIN — A historic landmark on Franklin road, parts of which date back to 1823, changed hands recently.

The sale of the property and buildings of the Hunter's Whip, quaint dining spot, was announced by their owner of 36 years, George Wellington Smith.

Smith said Mr. and Mrs. Hugo Post, of 26245 Vincennes, Franklin, who have operated the Hunter's Whip since 1958 on a rental basis, now are the new owners.

The transaction included the frame building (once Smith's real estate office and said to be a portion of the original village school) several small out-buildings; 150 feet of frontage on Franklin road and property "deep enough to develop into ample parking spaces" for the growing business.

THE SALE amplifies the confidence an energetic group of new, young business people have in the "Town That Time Forgot". One by one, the picturesque old structures, along the village's abbreviated Main Street, have been purchased and remodeled, carefully keeping the traditional New England character preserved. Jointly five enterprises have become known as Franklin Village Fashions with the Hunter's Whip, the pioneering member.

The Hunter's Whip began as a tea room but quickly expanded its operation to include a complete catering service and full diners.
