WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

T. B. From Telephones

- Periodic Heaviness
- Clotting
- Ovary Removal

Q. What is the risk of infection with T. B. from telephones?

A. Tuberculosis germs are projected when infected persons cough or sneeze. If they cough or sneeze directly into the mouthpiece there would be some danger of another user picking up the germs. This danger might be reduced by removing the mouthpiece and washing it with soap and hot water. It should then be swabbed with an antiseptic solution. It might be simpler to cover the mouthpiece with a piece of facial tissue, which may be discarded after use.

Q. About a week before my times my legs get "heavy" and I have the distinct sensation of gaining weight. Is this normal?

A. The feeling of leg "heaviness" may be more real than fancied. Several medical investigators state that about 25 to 30 per cent of women gain weight just before each period. The temporary gain in weight, which may amount to several pounds, is due to increased accumulation of tissue fluids. The condition, then, isn't so unusual and should not be alarming. However, your doctor can recommend measures to help.

Q. What causes menstrual clots?

A. Medical authorities generally agree that menstrual blood usually coagulates or clots, but is liquefied by vaginal enzymes before it is expelled. A deficiency of the vaginal substances would result in the passing of clots. The presence of small clots in menstrual blood is not abnormal or unusual. However, the occurrence of large clots calls for medical consultation.

Q. If both ovaries are removed are shots needed later?

A. Removal of the ovaries during reproductive years brings on an "artificial" menopause. Hormone injections may be required for a time to help the woman adjust.
