Mrs. Olivia Thomas, supervisor of the Birmingham branch of the Oakland Child Guidance clinic since it began operation in January 1956, has announced her resignation as of Dec. 2. Mrs. Thomas will be assuming a new role as mother with the birth of her child in mid-December.

H. W. McEachern has been appointed as the new branch supervisor by the board of the Oakland Child Guidance clinic beginning Dec. 5. McEachern has been with the clinic program as a psychiatric social worker since May, 1957.
