

Unexpected Visitor Delays Honored Guest

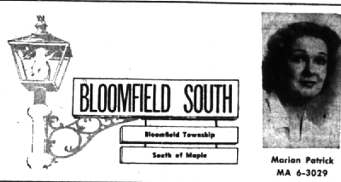

Cranbrook Show Reveals 'Invisible' Phase of World

"Flash! The Invisible World Revealed!" is the title of an exhibition of ultra high-speed electronic flash-light photographs which go on view at Cranbrook Institute of Science Dec. 2 to Jan. 1.

The photographs are the work of Dr. Harold E. Edgerton who is responsible for pioneering the development of the stroboscopic (literally "whirling viewer"), and the related electronic flash photographic equipment now extensively used in engineering and in science to gather information about rapidly moving subjects.

USE OF stroboscopic equipment has made it possible to photograph a bullet in flight, the motion of a hummingbird's wings, the explosion of a dynamite cap, the impact of a baseball and bat, and the intricate motions of a ballet dancer.

Dr. Edgerton recently has become interested in underwater photography and has made pictures of sea life as deep as four miles. Some of these will be included in the Institute's exhibit, as well as unpublished photographs.

OTHER NEW exhibits on view at Cranbrook Institute of Science include deep sea fishes as small as insects, copper mining in Lake Boyce and new items in the field of physics.

The Institute's museum of natural history is open daily except major holidays, from 2 to 5 p.m. Free weekdays; admission charge on weekends.
