

# Recreation Round-Up

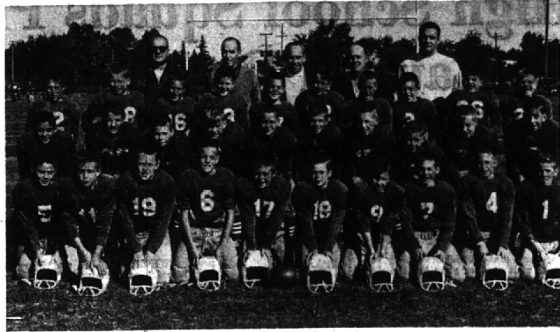
**SATURDAY SWIMMING (CLASSES):** The Saturday morning swimming classes at Derby, Seaholm and Barnum pools will not be held Nov. 29 due to the Thanksgiving holidays. Classes will resume Dec. 3 and end on Dec. 17. Registration for the winter series of classes will be taken from Dec. 19-30.

**HOCKEY TRYOUTS:** Try-outs for all boys who have registered for the hockey program will be held at Eon Park Municipal Rink on Saturday, Nov. 29 from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. Any resident of the city and school district of Birmingham between the ages of 13 and 17 as of Aug. 1, 1960 is eligible for tryouts. All boys 9 to 13 years of age may attend the clinic and scrimmage sessions beginning Dec. 3 from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. Fee is 25 cents per session.

**FAMILY SWIMMING:** Family swimming will begin at Derby pool Thursday, Dec. 1 from 7:15 to 9:45 p.m. Children must be accompanied in the water by an adult. Fees are 75 cents for adults and 25 cents for children. Family swimming is also held at Seaholm pool on Monday evenings from 7:30 to 10.

**BOYS BASKETBALL:** Any boys in the 9th to 12th grades interested in playing in the senior boys basketball leagues this season should register at the Recreation office, Municipal building, MI 4-1800. Any adult interested in coaching a basketball team should also call the Recreation office. Games will be played on Wednesday nights at Derby gym beginning Jan. 4.

**TEEN CENTER:** The Teen Center will be open Friday, Nov. 25 from 9:30 to 12 for all senior high school students in the Birmingham school district. Membership cards may be purchased at the door for \$1.50. Guests of members are allowed for 75 cents each. Music will be furnished by the 8-Quire, a popular combo featuring musicians from Seaholm high.

some \$17½ million on the sport, not including equipment, according to a recent ski industry survey.

This cold weather sport has been booming throughout the state in recent years, particularly since 1953 when a total of 38 ski centers across Michigan had 65,000 skiers.

In seven years the number of ski areas has almost doubled and new members have swelled the growing ranks of ski enthusiasts.

A NEW STATEWIDE winter vacation guide, pinpointing and describing each of Michigan's 74 winter sports centers, is available after Nov. 25 from the state tourist council.

Free copies can be obtained by writing to: Ski Map, Michigan Tourist Council, Lansing 26.

The 74 areas, dotting the Michigan map from the far reaches of the upper peninsula to the fringes of metropolitan Detroit, offer a variety of slopes for beginners as well as experts and intermediate skiers.

IN ADDITION to downhill skiing, Michigan's winter scene features cross-country trails, slalom bowls, toboggan runs, skating rinks, ice fishing, ice boating and hunting.

Indoor facilities at many ski centers include lodge, dormitory and motel accommodations, restaurants, snack bars, lounges and warming shelters.

Skis, boots and poles can be rented at most Michigan areas, and several centers offer ski week "packages" vacations that include lodging, meals, equipment and instructors.

**SOUTHFIELD:** The Blue Jays will be shooting for a top spot in the Inter-Lakes league. Will 65 varsity and reserve players trying out coach Will Steinke plans on cutting to 35.

Varsity players Phil Swaly, John VanBrunt, Les Wilkinson and Harry Hedjeka will see another season's action with a couple promising additions.

Steinke is counting on Mike Fourier to come off center and newcomer John Francis who was ineligible last year as a transfer student is displaying good form.
