Minor Says He's Still Surprised

"I'm still so surprised I haven't been able to figure it out," Jack W. Minor said Tuesday after his resignation was requested Friday by Chrysler officials.

Minor, director of marketing for Plymouth-DeSoto-Valiant division, was asked to leave because of interests in advertising firms doing business with Chrysler.

Minor, who lives at 1536 Dorchester road, Birmingham, is the second top Chrysler official to resign since July for outside interests.

Minor was responsible for all phases of advertising, sales promotion, merchandising, sales training, public relations and special events for three of the six lines of cars manufactured by the corporation.

Bentley: Krushchev Has A Reason for His Antics

Soviet Russia's "little fat man" is pounding his United Nations' desk, haranguing the delegates, and generally making a nuisance of himself for a very sound reason, according to Congressman Alvin Bentley.

Khrushchev's just suffered a stinging defeat on events in the Congo, so he's trying now to win concessions from the UN in order to re-establish himself in the eyes of some 50 middle-grade nations.

Bentley was on a tour of Oakland county in his campaign to unseat Patrick McNamara (D) in next Nov. 8 as much as possible, Bentley wound up his day with an evening address at Troy high school before a crowd of 150 persons.

ELECTED TO THE House of Representatives in 1955, Bentley has served on its European affairs committee, and has spent considerable time on his own touring foreign countries.

"We must assume Khrushchev is making these wild statements and demonstrations for a very sound purpose," Bentley told the Rotarians.

"He's trying to be so distasteful to us and the neutral nations in order to quiet him down," the Republican senatorial candidate believes.

Green and Farmington Interceptors; Sewage Flowing

The Evergreen and Farmington interceptors are open. Only the court cases filed by area communities against Detroit and Oakland county departments of public works are yet to be withdrawn before the sewage can be considered "free flowing."

A BRICK BULKHEAD, chopped away Monday on Southfield road some 150 feet south of Eight Mile road, started the flow from the Evergreen, and the Farmington systems into Detroit facilities.

THE ULTIMATE in the usage of the Evergreen and Farmington interceptors, constructed with the sale of \$12,007,000 general obligation bonds, won't be realized for possibly 25 years, Alexander said.

DURING THE MONTHS of negotiations, the completed internal systems north of 14 Mile road temporarily dumped into the old Birmingham treatment plant, Alexander said it would be about another week before the link bypassing the plant and connecting into the main interceptor is completed.

What Should We Teach Our Girls?

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the first of a series of three articles viewing the home economics programs taught in the Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills and Southfield schools. Its purpose will be to explain what is taught and why.

The whole issue boils down to some basic values. What kind of an education should a modern girl have? I recently joined a group of parents and school board members who favor a change in the junior high school education of Birmingham area girls.

What Should We Teach Our Girls?

They were prepared with arguments to support my jobs at home economics. It should be an elective, I had contended. Girls should be permitted to substitute home economics in the seventh grade only if the measure makes it elective in the eighth grade, beginning with September, 1961.
