Registration for classes at Will-O-Way Apprentice Theatre will remain open thru Saturday, October 8. Classes begin this week.

To the classes offered previously at the theatre, Celia Merrill Turner, director, has added a theatre course in mime and lively seminars in costume and set design.

Mrs. Turner and Carol Rosenberger, a fine young concert pianist, will offer semi-private and private lessons in piano and violin. Also offered will be classes in keyboard harmony, composition and folk singing with guitar or mandolin.

Teaching modeling in an eight-week course will be Henrietta Hermetin, who will also teach the course in Mime. She has studied with Martha Graham, Jose Limon, and the Anthony Manns in the art of acting and holds degrees from the University of Michigan and Wayne State university. Miss Hermetin has also played with the American mime theatre.

Mrs. Suren (Grace) Pifalian, a graduate of Columbia university teachers' college and a well-known professional designer, will conduct the seminars in costume and set design between 3 and 4:15 p.m. Saturday. All students are invited to attend.

AN ADDED feature will be a lecture by J. Dorsey Callaghan, Detroit Free Press drama critic, on "History of the Theatre in America", Tuesday evening, Nov. 1.

Modeling classes meet once weekly, at 7 to 8:30 p.m. Mondays or Wednesdays. At the conclusion, girls will present a fashion show. The course will include figure analysis, personality in speech and microphone technique for commentators, posture and carriage, fashion understanding, make-up and hair-styling.

A representative of a commercial motion picture company in Detroit will discuss the needs and demands of the industry for trained professional models. Theatre classes are divided into three sections—speech, mime and play production.
