### Register Now—Or You Can't Vote For Dick or Jack

With registration deadline (Monday, Oct. 10) just four days away, clerk's offices throughout the area are remaining open extra hours so that every prospective voter can register for the Nov. 8 election.

Everyone who has the following qualifications by election day may vote: Citizen of the United States; 21 years old; resident of state six months; resident of city or township 30 days prior to Nov. 8.

People who have moved from one address to another within their city or township should transfer their registration. And people who have moved from outside the municipality should register in the new locale.

**OTHER THAN** invalids, registration must be done in person. Invalids are registered in their homes by appointment with the clerk's office.

Fifteen-minute sessions will take place in the classrooms, where the teacher will discuss curriculum and answer questions.

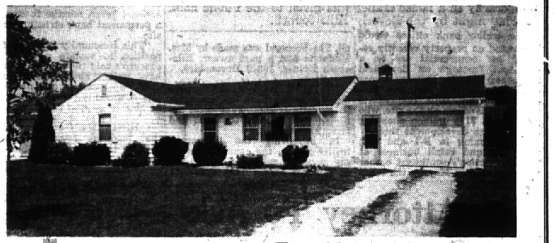
There will be no business meeting, but the annual bake sale will be held.

#### Council Approves Sewer Program

office investigation was a routine matter in all fatal accidents. He said that a court reporter and another assistant prosecutor had gone to William Beaumont hospital to take a statement from Boyle after he was treated there for minor cuts sustained in the accident.

"His attorney refused then to permit him to make a statement," Condit said.

Because the Boyle boy's age puts him under juvenile court jurisdiction, he has no duty to make a statement to the prosecutor, Condit said. Juvenile courts waive jurisdiction only in the most serious cases, which this is not, Condit said.

HE ADDED, "We don't draw any implications from Boyle's refusal to come in."

The attorney and the assistant prosecutor did not agree on one aspect of the case.

Condit believed that Boyle's car collided first with the high wheels at the front of the grader, and then hit the blade, which he estimated, was raised about six inches above the road.

Sauer insists the car collided first with the wide blade, and not the grader wheels.

"There have been a lot of insurance people around seeking information," said the assistant prosecutor.

### Plan Dual Events At Local Church

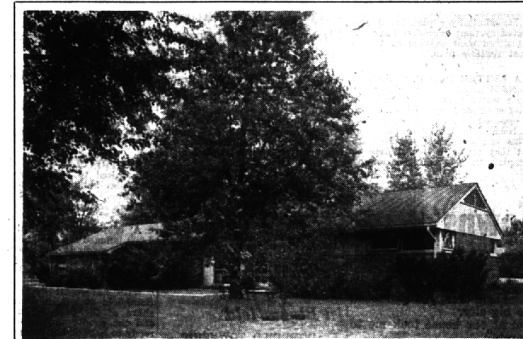

### Bloomfield Woman Treated for Injury

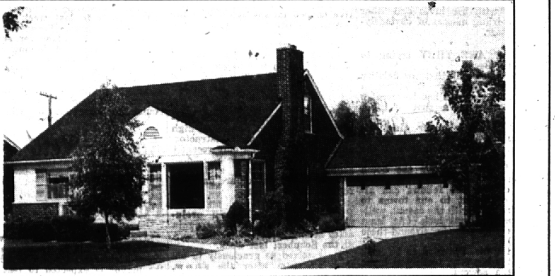
