BLOOMFIELD HILLS—Thieves ransacked and robbed a Bloomfield Hills home Wednesday, Sept. 28 of \$9,000 in cash and jewelry. Police believe the theft may have been done by someone who had access to the home with a key. No signs of forced entry were found.
