Traffic Control On Woodward Ave. To Be Discussed

Oakland County Prosecutor George F. Taylor said Wednesday that he plans to arrange a meeting next week with Birmingham and Royal Oak police chiefs, to seek stiffer traffic enforcement on Woodward avenue.

Taylor, 64, was challenged to four drag races between 11 Mile and 14 Mile road on his way home from a meeting this week.

Taylor said the area police departments were doing a good job but more men and more cars are needed.

"ADEQUATE TRAFFIC enforcement is difficult," Taylor commented, "because it consumes so many men and cars. Crime investigation is behind as a result," he added.

Taylor also mentioned that he will ask area judges to attend the meeting. He will seek a firmer attitude from the courts on drag racing.

Terming drag racers as somewhat "seasonal," Taylor said he did not blame teenagers in general. "There are only a few that are responsible, but they must be curtailed," Taylor stated.

He cited Woodward avenue in Royal Oak and Hunter north of Maple as the area where most of the racing has occurred.

Ghana Representative Named UN Day Speaker

Paul Baddoo, president of the Ghana Student's association of the U.S. and Canada, will be the local United Nations day speaker.

His address, in observance of the 15th anniversary of the founding of United Nations, is scheduled for 8 p.m. Oct. 26 in the new building of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, on Woodward at Chesterfield.

From 300 to 400 people, about half of them students, are expected to attend the program.

Birmingham city commissioners this week appropriated \$100 to donate to the Oakland county chapter of the American Society for the United Nations, sponsoring organization. They joined other participating communities in peace and freedom.

Former B'ham Police Officer Dies in Yuma

A 37-year-old former Birmingham policeman who left the force three years ago to buy a bar in Yuma, Mich., died last Thursday of self-inflicted wounds.

William E. Andrews, owner of the Yuma Bar, was buried Monday at Sunset Memorial Gardens, Port Huron.

Andrews, according to Bostick chapel in Cadillac, had suffered severe headaches caused from an injury during World War II. He was despondent because of pending brain surgery and poor business conditions, they said.

HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE V.F.S., AmVets, James E. Dillon Lodge No. 466 F and AM of Mesick, Michigan. He was also a member of Traverse City Chapter 102 R.A.M.

Andrews served in the European Theatre in World War II, received five bronze battle stars and was receiving disability compensation for an injury suffered during battle. He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Alice Wiegand of Yuma; his father, J. Andrews of Grayling; two brothers, Belbert of Port Huron and Edward Jay of Wayne, and one sister, Mrs. Howard Bisnett of Oklawaha.

FUNERAL SERVICES were Saturday at Bostick chapel in Cadillac under the auspices of the James E. Dillon Lodge. Additional services were Monday at the Smith Funeral home in Port Huron. Both services were conducted by Capt. Stange of the Salvation Army.
