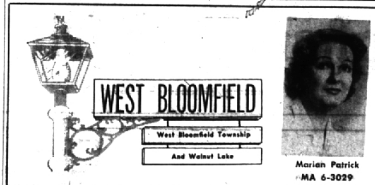

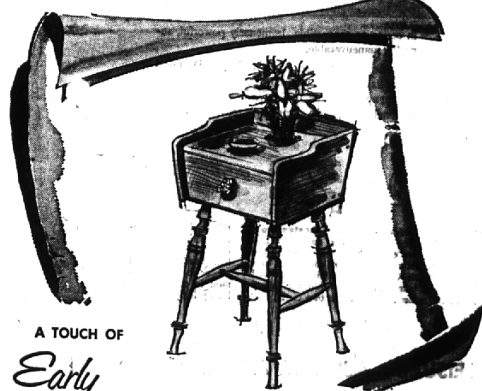
WIRE LIFT WITHOUT WIRE
