

Section 1.0. The 1959 edition of the National Electrical Code and the Uniform Electrical Rules, supplementary to the 1959 edition of the National Electrical Code, are hereby adopt-ed as part of this section as fully as if set out herein, and shall govern and be observed and followed in all elec-trical wiring, and in the construction, installation, repair, afterations, operation and maintenance of electrical wiring, apparatus or fixtures except insofar as they may be in conflict with specific sections of this ordinance or local rules determined by the Village Council under this ordinance. Notice is hereby given that complete copies of the Code and the Uniform Electrical Rules are avail-able for public use and inspection at the office of the Village Clerk."

Section 2.01. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emer gency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preserva-tion of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become ef-fective immediately upon publication.
