

**VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 40**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 12 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, ELECTRICAL DEVICES AND ELECTRICAL MATERIAL; PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGISTRATION OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS AND JOURNEMEN; PROVIDING FOR A RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENT FOR THE RECOGNITION AND EXAMINATION OF LICENSES ISSUED BY OTHER MUNICIPALITIES IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF."

Section 1.01. That Section 6 of Ordinance No. 12 entitled "An Ordinance for Safeguarding Life and Property by Regulating and Providing for the Inspection of the Installation and Maintenance of Electrical Wiring, Electrical Devices and Electrical Material; Providing for the Licensing and Registration of Electrical Contractors and Journeymen; Providing for a Reciprocal Arrangement for the Recognition and Examination of Licenses Issued by Other Municipalities in the State of Michigan; and Providing a Penalty for Violations Thereof" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.01. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon publication.

**VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 41**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 29 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS; THE SIZE OF OPEN SPACES; THE DENSITY OF POPULATION; THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS AND LAND FOR TRADE, RESIDENCE AND OTHER PURPOSES; CREATING DISTRICTS FOR SAID PURPOSES AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH DISTRICTS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; ESTABLISHMENT OF A ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE."

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 29 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating and Restricting the Height, Number of Stories and Size of Buildings; The Size of Open Spaces; The Density of Population; The Location and Use of Buildings and Land for Trade, Residence and Other Purposes; Creating Districts for Said Purposes and Establishing the Boundaries Thereof; Providing for Changes in Regulations and Boundaries of Such Districts; Defining Certain Terms Used Herein; Providing for Enforcement; Establishment of a Zoning Board of Appeals; and Imposing Penalties for the Violation of this Ordinance" be and the same hereby is amended by amending the Schedule of Regulations attached thereto and made a part thereof as follows:

"That the following described property is changed from a residential one (R-1) zone use to parking (P) zone use:

The North 127 feet of the South 188 feet of the South 200 feet of the North 491 feet of Lots 13 and 14 of Crayth Springs Subdivision."

Section 2.01. Public hearing having been held hereon October 3, 1960, and the statutory notices having been published and mail, the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety and hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, this 3rd day of October A.D. 1960.
