### Junior Marshalls Take Active Part In Fire Safety

National fire prevention week, Oct. 9-15, will engage local members of the national Junior fire marshal brigade in activities at home and school, designed to promote fire safety during the coming year.

Boys and girls from five to 10 years of age will join with more than three million fellow JFM members in the United States to help focus attention on fundamentals of fire safety, according to insurance man Ray E. Becker, of 32300 Sheridan, Beverly Hills.

Becker's agency sponsors the village's Junior Fire Marshal program in cooperation with Greenfield school and the public safety department, under Director Robert Murphy.

"When you consider that more than 11,000 persons—one-third of them children—die each year as the result of fires, the importance of fire prevention education for boys and girls is particularly significant," Becker said. "The nation's annual property loss from fire is more than \$1 billion," he added.

"THE children they learn about fire safety will stay with them all their lives and be invaluable in the continuing fight against fire," he said.

Local Junior fire marshalls will concentrate their fire prevention week activities on a home fire inspection report. To qualify as Junior fire marshalls, youngsters must check their own homes for fire hazards, complete an inspection report which parents sign, and return it to their teacher.

The Home inspection report form appears in the fall issue of the Junior fire marshal magazine, which Becker said was distributed to 2,500 children on Oct. 10. Youngsters filling out their reports receive official JFM helmets and badges.

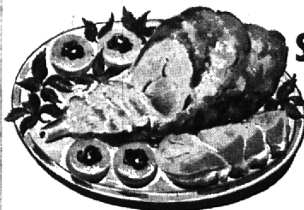
