"As far as recreation area is concerned, Birmingham is in pretty good shape," said recreation director Donald Martin who recently returned from the five-day meeting of the 42nd National Recreation Congress in Washington, D.C.

Recreation in the out-of-door can help foster national strength, Martin, because the American character was hardened by the trials associated with the out-of-door—self-reliance and hardiness.

MARTIN CITED Birmingham's summer program for youth fitness, which was an outgrowth of the President's White House conference, as an example of a step in the right direction.

Lathrup Prepares To Sign Dotted Line on Contract

LATHRUP - Council members Monday unanimously authorized Mayor Richard N. Cogger and City Clerk Frank Dink to execute a storm water contract with city engineers Ayres, Lewis, Norris and Day.

The contract hires ALN&M to make preliminary study and report, an economic analysis and recommendation for the most feasible solution to the storm water problem.

ALN&M will re-study plans and cost estimates, will be authorized to prepare final plans and specifications. Each report will be referred to the council for approval.

THE PRELIMINARY report is already well underway and will be ready by Dec. 1.

After a lengthy discussion, Norris agreed to the termination provision to avoid a council split in contract approval.

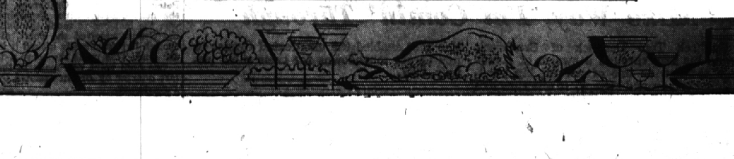
