THE YELLOWJACKETS main problem, he said, is lack of enough players to replace first stringers.

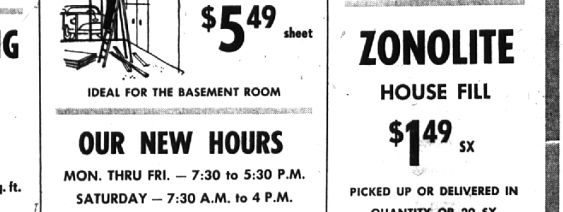
"Because of the smallness of the squad," said Anderson, "most of our first stringers are forced to play the entire game."
