New DeSoto Retains Old Streamlined Look

The established engineering and styling elements such as single unit construction, torsion har suspension, and the fleet, finned look have been retained in the new De Sote. Although some interesting developments have been made under the hood, the big overall change for 1961 is the sum total of many subtle refinements and improvements.

The 361 cubic inch V-8 engine that is standard in all De Sotos for '61 has a 9 to 1 compression ratio with a horsepower rating of 255. Engineers lowered the com-pression ratio from 10 to 1 to give DeSoto its new, economic power ulant.

IN STYLING, Desoto has maintained the streamlined look of motion with sweeping fins. All' De Sotos for 1961 will be hardtops. The hardtops lend themselves well to an advanced design theme that starts with canted headlights framing a horizontal grille topped by a distinctive air scoop. The sides are clean with one spear of molding running the length of other car. The sculptured fins begin at the frunt doors and sweep lank to balance the gently curving rear deck.

THE WINDSHIELD slants straight up to the roof line, eliminating distortion caused by a curved upper edge, yet the glass occupies the same specious area as last year's model.

A new roof design on the fourdoor model features twin speed lines from front to rear.
