**VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 40**  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 12 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE FOR SAFEGUARDING LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND MAINTAINING THE INSTALLATION OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRICAL MATERIALS; PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGISTRATION OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS AND JOURNEYMEN; PROVIDING FOR A REGISTRATION ARRANGEMENT FOR THE RECOGNITION AND EXAMINATION OF LICENSES ISSUED BY OTHER MUNICIPALITIES IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF."  
The Village of Beverly Hills Ordinance No. 12 entitled "An Ordinance for Safeguarding Life and Property by Regulating and Providing for the Installation and Maintenance of Electrical Wiring, Electrical and Electrical Materials; Providing for the Licensing and Registration of Electrical Contractors and Journeymen; Providing for a Registration Arrangement for the Recognition and Examination of Licenses Issued by Other Municipalities in the State of Michigan; and Providing a Penalty for Violations Thereof" is and, the same is hereby amended to read as follows:  
Section 1.01. That Section 6 of Ordinance No. 12 entitled "An Ordinance for Safeguarding Life and Property by Regulating and Providing for the Installation and Maintenance of Electrical Wiring, Electrical and Electrical Materials; Providing for the Licensing and Registration of Electrical Contractors and Journeymen; Providing for a Registration Arrangement for the Recognition and Examination of Licenses Issued by Other Municipalities in the State of Michigan; and Providing a Penalty for Violations Thereof" is and, the same is hereby amended to read as follows:  
Section 4. Adoption of National Electrical Code. The 1950 edition of the National Electrical Code and the Uniform Electrical Code, hereinafter to be referred to as the National Electrical Code, are hereby adopted as part of this section as fully as if set out in full and in the construction, installation, repair, alteration, extension and maintenance of electrical wiring, apparatus or systems in this ordinance or local rules amendments, specific Ordinance except insofar as they may be in conflict with specific provisions of this ordinance or local rules amendments, specific Ordinance under this ordinance. Notice is hereby given that complete copies of the Code and the Uniform Electrical Code are available for public use and inspection at the office of the Village Clerk.  
Section 5.01. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon publication.  
Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, the 15th day of October A. D. 1960.
