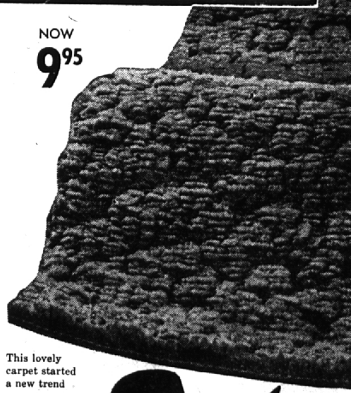

Robert A. Herzberg, widely-known artist, died Friday in Bloomfield Hills after a short illness. He lived at 1936 Holland, Birmingham.

WHEN MR. Herzberg was 21, he left home to study at the Chicago Art Institute where he took for his tuition, room and board by working as a busboy in restaurants and as an usher in theaters.

At the institute he studied under Vandybent, Atkinson, and Van Dine. He won first prize in the painting contest at the Detroit school of fine and applied art.

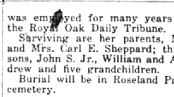

BOTH KUSK and Gene Lokojarvi are in serious condition, according to what hospital officials said Wednesday. Kusk sustained chest and hip injuries.
