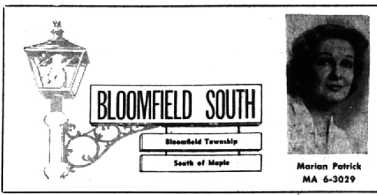
## Westchester WNFGA to Hear Guest Speaker
