THE FIVE "foster parents" received a history of the little boy plus a photograph and the two-way correspondence bridges the gap between them and their child. The feeling of security and love and the knowledge that "someone cares" is a vital factor in Ho Van Mai's well-being.

That is why Mrs. Newman says, "We derive a great deal of satisfaction, especially from our own children's reaction and we heartily recommend that others 'adopt' a child through this plan."

The monthly cash grant provides a child with nourishment, suitable clothing and emergency medical care. In the case of the little Vietnamese boy who is a first grader in primary school, and an obedient and good student, it means that he may fulfil his desire to grow up and become a clerk.

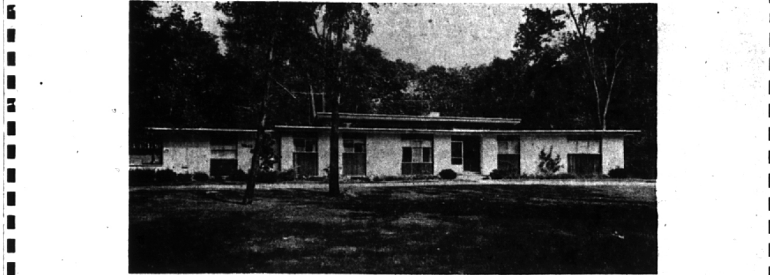
