

**Sewer, Water Main Contract Awarded**

City commissioners this week awarded a contract for sewer and water main construction on Forest and Oak to the Dams Construction Company, Clawson, on its low bid of \$6,132.75.

To be constructed are a 12-inch sewer on Forest east of Elm and an 8-inch sewer and 6-inch water main on Oak from Woodward to midway between Woodward and Hunter, Nov. 26 is the completion date.

**City Moves to Provide Ruffner Sewer Relief**  
 Plans are under way today to prepare sewer relief for residents on Ruffner between Grant and Woodward.  
 City engineers, on authority from the city commission, are preparing drawings for sewer relief for that section of Ruffner.  
 In a comprehensive report to commissioners Monday night, City Engineer W. T. Killen explained that basement floodings in that area, have occurred on the section of the Ruffner sewer tributary to Woodward.  
 HE RECOMMENDED that the 332-foot section of 10-inch sewer extending from Woodward west on Ruffner be replaced when permits can be obtained from the state health department.  
 Such permits can not be obtained until a Supreme court decision is rendered on the Twelve Towns drain.  
 Killen said an engineering department study of the sewer problem in the Ruffner-Grant area shows the following problems:  
 Many of the area sewers, including the trunk line on Woodward are shallow.  
 The first section of sewer extending west of Woodward on Woodward.

Drainage structures in that section were restricted this fall, he explained; and residents who have not disconnected their downspouts as yet could help relieve the situation by doing so.  
 On motion of Commissioner William H. Burzum, the commission authorized the engineers to proceed with drawings for the design of sewer relief on that section of Ruffner.

**Rescind Policy On Financing of Special Districts**  
 City commissioners Monday rescinded a 1950 resolution governing the financing of special assessment districts.  
 This resolution outlined a policy in which the city would not proceed with construction in these districts until 75 per cent of the property owners' share had been paid.  
 Then it would proceed only in cases where sufficient funds were available in the revolving fund to finance construction in such a project.  
 CITY MANAGER L. R. Gare suggested that the resolution be revised to provide that a special assessment district was open be credited either to the general fund or to whatever fund that might finance any part of private property owners' share.  
 Commissioner Charles W. Renfrew wondered whether the city needed any policy and moved to rescind the old resolution, drawing support from Commissioner William E. Roberts. His motion passed unanimously.
