# Church Women Observe World Community Day

"Power Among Men" the first United Nations full-length film will be the feature of Birmingham United Church women's World Community Day, Nov. 4 at the Christian church.

This prize-winning film has won the Robert Flaherty Award for the "most outstanding creative achievement in documentary films." It is the "most important motion picture of the decade" and "a film not only to watch for, but to demand." It has been equally well received by educational and religious groups.

"Power Among Men" was filmed in color in four regions of the world, depicting episodes in Italy, Haiti, British Columbia and Norway.

THE THEME of World Community day for 1960 is "Christian Action for Freedom." United Church Women observe the first Friday in November each year as a service of rededication to action that gives meaning to Christian concerns.

Children's nightwatches are needed in overseas church-supported institutions, homes and hospitals. The home medical kits are for rural overseas areas lacking in medical services. Yard goods are needed for refugee families in North Africa, India and Hong Kong.

The offering will help train women in nutrition, child welfare or social work in Ethiopia, Nigeria, Burma and provide health workers for a newly established nutrition program in the churches of Chile.
