Life must seem rather dull for John Bowen III since returning to his Birmingham home at 991 Lak Park from a 30-day African safari. Nicknamed "lucky hunter" by the natives, Bowen bagged just about every wild animal imaginable including a pure black leopard which is said to be the first one killed by an American in Kenya, Africa. Shoot first and get friendly later was the novice's attitude toward this rugged, snorting rhinoceros. The rhinoceros' nearsightedness gave Bowen an edge in his game as he cut off the 22-inch horned, charging beast and emptied his gun into it.

## Look B'wana No Cavities

Many hunters would give their eye teeth for a pair of trophies like these 110-pound tusks, but in this case it was the elephant that lost its choppers. Only 30 yards away, the mammoth animal turned and charged at the crack of the first shot but the sustained fire of Bowen's Winchester 458 finally brought it to the ground. Although surrounded by herds of elephants and other wild beasts, Bowen claims he "felt safer than I would walking down the streets of Detroit." Although the elephant's head seems to make a more comfortable cushion than a living room sofa, it will decorate a wall of Bowen's planned trophy room.



## Move Over, Show-Off

It took nine shots to stop this beefy African buffalo after tracking the brute for five and six hours at a time. Heavy and frequent rains kept the herd moving and "by the time we got it, he was really sweating it out," said Bowen. The hunt measured a 45-inch spread between horns. Of the dozen animals bagged, Bowen is having seven of the larger animals' heads and the entire prize leopard mounted for a trophy room. The elephant's tusks, zebra skins and many other smaller trophies will be included in his collection of African souvenirs.

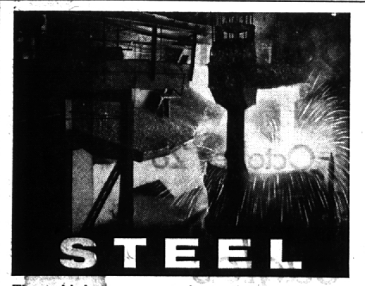
