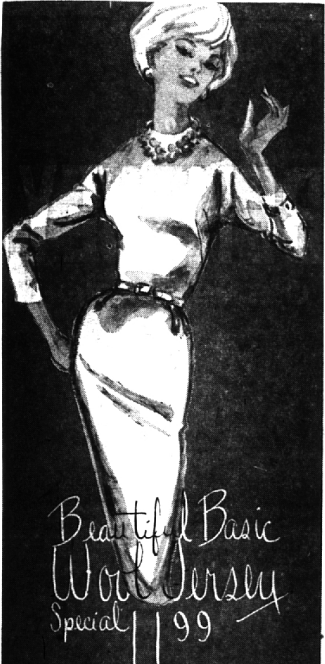


Cited for Honors
