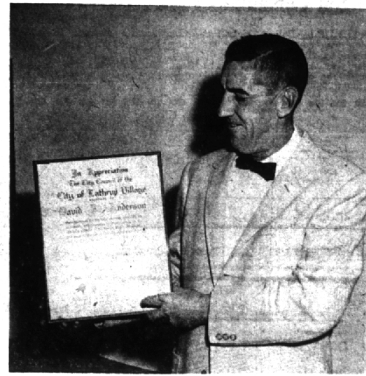




Lathrup Puts 'Thanks' In Writing

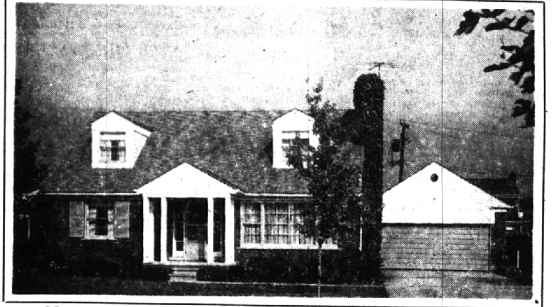

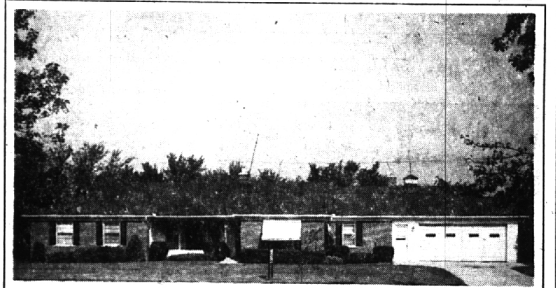

Speakers to Talk On Flowers, Greens

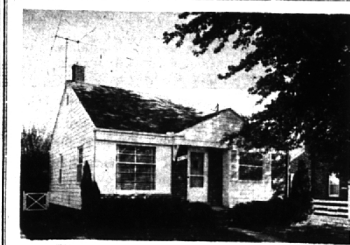
