Congregationals to Start New Education Program

The board of Christian education of the Congregational Church of Birmingham announces the introduction of a new course for three-year-olds, to be used in the church school, beginning Sept. 11.

"Three's in the Christian Community" is the first unit of the United Church curriculum, which is being developed by the educational agencies of the Congregational churches and the Evangelical and Reformed church. Many pastors, teachers, parents and children, as well as Christian education leaders and experts in related fields, have contributed to the preparation of this curriculum. The nursery course was written by Phoebe M. Anderson of Chicago, mother of three children and an authority in the field of nursery education. The art work was prepared under the direction of James P. Pfeiffer of the Rhode Island school of design, and marks a significant advance in the use of contemporary art forms in church school materials.

THE UNITED CHURCH curriculum is designed to help persons of all ages in the Christian community. At the nursery level these tasks are accomplished by providing such child with repeated experiences of being loved, understood, accepted; of finding people trustworthy and dependable; of entering the church to be a place that knows him personally and cares for him deeply.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given of a public hearing to be held by the Bloomfield Township Board at the Bloomfield Township Hall, 4210 Woodward Road, Tuesday, September 6, 1960 at 8:00 p.m. to consider the following changes in the Bloomfield Township Ordinance, being Ordinance No. 21, to be amended by adding the following:

SECTION VII-A. P-I VEHICULAR PARKING ZONES
Providing for Vehicular Parking Zones.

PREAMBLE
The P-I VEHICULAR PARKING DISTRICTS are designed to accommodate the increased use of private automobiles in the community, to provide a safe and orderly parking area within their own district boundaries.

1. The parking area shall be necessary for use in connection with one or more business establishments, or in connection with one or more existing professional or institutional office buildings or institutions.

2. The parking area shall be used solely for parking of private passenger vehicles, for periods of less than one hour.

3. No signs of any kind, other than signs designating entrances, exits, and conditions of use, shall be maintained on such parking area.

4. No building other than those for the use of the parking area shall be erected upon the premises.

5. Such parking areas shall be situated on premises which have an area of not less than six thousand (6,000) sq. ft. and shall be contiguous to a Commercial Zone.

6. Application for P-I District use shall be made to the Township Zoning Board by submitting a layout of the area area requested for "P-I" use.

PARKING LAYOUT, ENTRANCE AND EXIT
Such off-street parking lots shall be laid out, constructed and maintained in accordance with the following standards and regulations.

1. All spaces shall be laid out in the dimensions of one by twenty (20) feet exclusive of the following item 2).

2. A minimum of one (1) space shall be provided for each vehicle.

3. The parking area shall be provided with a continuous and completely surrounding wall or masonry wall or fence (4' feet in height measured from the surface of the parking area. This wall or fence shall be provided with gates at all entrances and exits.

4. Whenever such wall is required, all entrances and exits shall be provided with gates. The gates shall be constructed of heavy-duty material and shall be maintained in a healthy, growing condition, neat and orderly in appearance.

5. The parking area shall be provided with a continuous and completely surrounding wall or masonry wall or fence (4' feet in height measured from the surface of the parking area. This wall or fence shall be provided with gates at all entrances and exits.

SURFACE OF PARKING AREA
The entire parking area, including parking spaces and maneuvering lanes required under this Section, shall be surfaced with a material of uniform composition, provided by the Township Board of Health, and shall be graded to provide for drainage of surface water.

APPROVAL AND MODIFICATION
1. The Board of Appeals, upon application by the property owner of the parking area, may modify the yard and wall requirements where, in unusual circumstances, no good purpose would be served by compliance with the requirements of this section.

2. In all cases where a wall extends to an alley which is a means of ingress and egress to a parking area, it shall be permitted to extend the wall not more than ten (10) feet from such alley line in order to permit a wider means of access to the parking area.

3. In addition to the above requirements, such parking area shall comply with such further requirements or conditions as may be prescribed by the Board of Appeals for the protection of the residential district abutting such parcel or parcels in which the parking area is to be located.
