Attorney General Warns Parents Of Music Fraud

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is one in a series of articles by Paul L. Adams, state attorney general, concerning frauds affecting the consumers of Michigan.

Using the child to get to the parent is a standard method of operation of the door-to-door musical instrument salesman.

My investigation shows he generally offers the prospective customer a free talent try-out and aptitude test for his child to determine whether or not the child has the necessary ability to play an accordion or other musical instrument.

If the parent will just sign the enrollment application for a minimum number of lessons, the child will be furnished instruction, the instrument and necessary materials free of charge. However, once a child has been signed up for the free try-out, he never fails it. Your child will be reported to have great aptitude and talent for playing the instrument the salesman is selling. After the child has been taught a few simple tunes, a meeting is arranged, so that the child can demonstrate his extraordinary ability. If the parent is disinclined to pay the high cost for the instrument, the enthusiasm or tears of his own child is generally enough

to overcome his reluctance.

THIS IS A standard gimmick and is usually successful because of the love of a parent for his child and his concern for his betterment.

Some salesmen promise to re-purchase the instrument if the child doesn't develop musically as

expected. But the details of the alleged repurchase are seldom covered in the contract; the purchase is left at the mercy of the salesman as far as the resale is concerned. Even if the instrument is resold, the parent generally suffers a substantial loss.

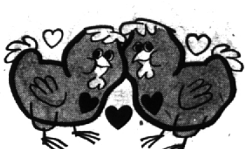
