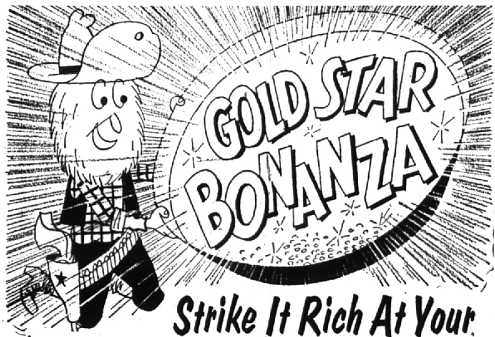

## WE ARE BACK IN BUSINESS AFTER A SENSELESS AND UNNECESSARY STRIKE

Settlement has been reached in the strike against the Grand Trunk Western Railroad on the same terms as offered to the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen prior to their work stoppage, with the addition of increased wage rates of approximately \$2.00 per day to about 23 men, or a total of \$46.00 per day.

Our efforts to solve the dispute by referral to arbitration or a one-man fact finding panel before the strike were refused by the union. They chose instead to force the railroad to shut down its operations by their work stoppage. Their gain by the strike amounts to a total of \$46.00 per day.

No apology is sufficient to express our regret over the interrupted service and hardship that this strike has caused those who depend on us for transportation service and for their livelihood. You who have known our service over the years will surely understand the depth of sincerity in the simple words, "we're sorry".
