One-day School
For Volunteers
Is Scheduled

The Michigan Federation of Music clubs and the department of music of MSU will co-sponsor a one-day school for volunteer workers in music therapy Tuesday at the Pontiac State hospital. Opening session will begin at 9 a.m. Interested community workers in music, including choir directors are invited to take part.

Purpose of this school is to aid volunteer workers in music therapy in bringing improved care and treatment to the mentally retarded, mentally ill and physically handicapped. It is the seventh of a series of similar conferences in Michigan and the second of an advanced series.
