TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, County of Oakland; State of Michigan:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in conformity with the Michigan Election Law, the final date for registration in order to vote in the General Election is Monday, October 10, 1960, at 8:00 p.m.

Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the City of Birmingham thirty days prior to November 8, 1960, are eligible to register.

Such transfer may be made any time up to and including Monday, October 10, 1960, at 8:00 p.m.
