Hospital Plan To Be Decided In April Vote

Voters in the April election will be well-informed about a proposal to construct a hospital in South-west Oakland county, according to one of the project's backers.

Calvin Monfils, administrator of the Community Hospital in Northville, said the delay until April will allow time to adequately prepare the proposal for placement on the ballot and to inform voters of the need for the hospital.

Monfils said the inclusion of the proposal to allow equal facilities for both medical doctors and osteopaths seemed definite.

PROPOSAL to form a hospital authority would generate more interest and notice in the local April election than in the November election, Monfils noted. Voters' approval of the authority would allow a levy of up to 40 cents for each \$1,000 assessed valuation against property owners in the area of the proposed hospital.

No site has been chosen but southwest Oakland county is favored because of accessibility, he said. Twelve communities in Oakland, Wayne and Washtenaw counties would benefit, Monfils said.

Health Department Plans Instruction For Diabetics

Five classes for diabetics and their families will begin Sept. 29, the Oakland county department of health announced recently. The classes, from 1 to 5 p.m. at the county health center, 1070 N. Telegraph road, will offer important information and knowledge about diabetes, said Health Director Dr. John D. Monroe.

The county health department will give information about the classes to interested persons, who must have written approval from their physicians.

The series will cover diet, insulin technique and oral agents, urine tests and personal hygiene.

Medical society and the Oakland county schools.

About three per cent of all children have some undetected hearing defect, according to Dr. John D. Monroe, health department director. The testing is designed to find even slight variations in hearing. Each child discovered to have a hearing loss will have the opportunity for a medical, eye, ear, nose and throat examination.

LAST YEAR, 17,300 children were screened in county schools. Of these, 1,219 had a hearing loss and 336 were given medical examinations. Medical recommendations were made when indicated.

Five County Men Make Honor Roll For Long Service

The list includes 20-year veterans who have served the state system without compensation since 1940. The total of 188 honor roll members are spread as 34 local board members, 31 government appeal agents and 123 medical advisors.

Gov. Rockefeller Set for Saturday Talk, Motorcade
