

Four MSU Courses Offered in B'ham

Four informal courses dealing with psychology, sociology, astronomy and ethics will be offered this fall in Birmingham by Michigan State University.

"Introduction to Psychology," "The Human Web: A Sociological Look at Mankind," "The Lore of the Stars" and "Christian Ethics" will be presented under the auspices of the MSU liberal arts adult education program, in cooperation with the Birmingham public schools.

The 10-week psychology course will be taught by Dr. Donald H. Elliott, associate professor of psychology at Wayne State University. Classes will meet Tuesdays, 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. at Groves high school, beginning Sept. 27.

The course serves as an introduction to the scientific study and interpretation of human behavior. Dr. Elliott explains, with emphasis on recent research and applications to everyday living. Brief explorations will also be made into the areas of psychopathology, psychotherapy and group problems.

DR. EDWARD C. JANDY, Wayne State University professor of sociology and anthropology, will teach the course, "The Human Web." Ten classes will be held 8 to 10 p.m. Thursdays at Groves high school, beginning Sept. 29.

The course will examine man both as an animal and as a "culture-builder." Dr. Jandy states, and as a product of his environment and culture. Emphasis will be placed on such topics as man's various cultures, his institutions and such current problems as the population explosion, he adds.

TEACHING THE elementary astronomy course will be MSU special lecturer William Schultz. Classes for the 10-week course will be held Thursdays from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. at Seaholm high school, beginning Sept. 29.

This course will acquaint the student with the solar system, the stars and other special objects, Schultz says, providing a firm basis for understanding and interpreting new developments in astronomy and space.

THE COURSE, "Christian Ethics," will be conducted by the Rev. Francis M. Donahue, MSU associate professor of humanities and religion. The 10-week course will meet Tuesdays from 8 to 10 p.m. at Groves high school, beginning Sept. 27.

Entry was made through a window on the second floor and the premises were ransacked. Police have no leads as yet.

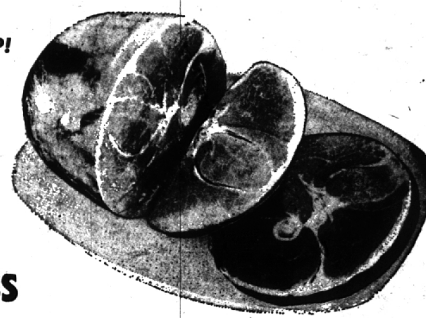
