\$1 Million Bond Sale Completed

SOUTHFIELD—Money from a bond sale will be used to pay for water, sewer and paving projects already underway in the City of Southfield. Southfield sold \$1,011,000 in special assessment bonds to the Braun, Bosworth Co., Toledo, Ohio, lowest of three bidders. The city will pay for the bonds from special taxes collected from

benefitting property owners. Interest cost on the bonds is 2.9225, or about \$500,000 over the next 10 years, the life of the bonds.

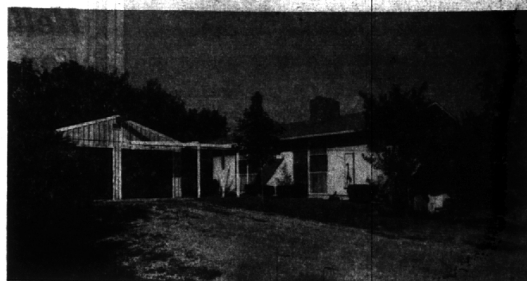

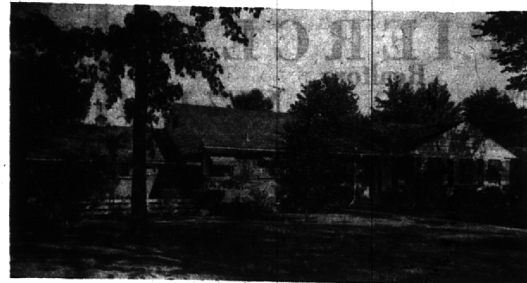
Pontiac Man Guilty Of Simple Larceny

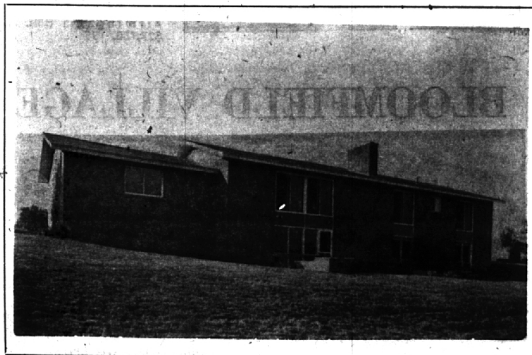

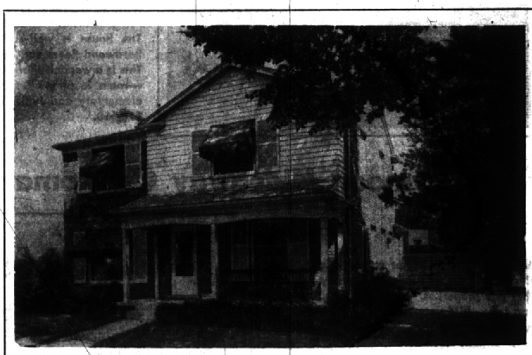
