BY YOUR LEAVE(S)

You should have one or more of the following pieces of equipment in order to take care of this "fun," but BIG problem:

THE LAWN:

It is later than you think! Your fall application of nourishment should have been applied 3 or 4 weeks ago. Judging by our stock pile some home owners just got back from Tibet or Cuba. However, IT IS NOT TOO LATE. Reduce the rate but GET IT ON NOW. The grass needs it even if you don't. Apply 10 to 15 lbs. of AGRICO, AGRICO U. F. or STADLER'S XXX to each 1,000 sq. ft.

Spots and areas that are dead from one cause or another, or by any other reasons, (dogs, divot diggers, etc.) should be loosened, seeded and watered every day in the middle of the day until Jupiter Pluvius takes over.

MOWING of the lawn is important in the way it is done. The more blade you leave (2" height) the more food will be made from the fertilizer and sent down for root development. The excess will be stored for early use in the spring while you are still working on your driveway ice or your skis (skez).

Before growth stops, the last two or three mowings should be at a LOWER HEIGHT to prevent "matting." 1½" inches for the average lawn, 1" to 1½" for merlot blue grass, less for BENT GRASS depending on your development program.

BULBS:
Over a hundred varieties of spring and summer flowering bulbs, roots and tubers with pictures, details etc. are arranged for your selection.

All bulbs except tulips should be planted NOW. It is better to plant tulips AFTER OCTOBER 15TH.

MILDEW:
It is showing up badly on roses and lawns. Spray with SULPHUR, CAPTAN or PHALTAN immediately.

On roses—remove all leaves from the ground and KEEP the ground clear of infected leaves. The mildew will stop soon—if the weather changes.

EVERGREENS: WATER, WATER, WATER—until the ground freezes.

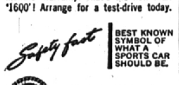
