It will be located on a four-acre site given to the Episcopal diocese of Michigan by the late Mrs. Henry Ford. The site adjoins St. Mark's church, Joy road near Greenfield. Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ford are buried in the churchyard of St. Mark's.

E. Lloyd Ecclestone, member of the board of trustees of St. Peter's, will be the general chairman of the drive. Mr. and Mrs. Alexander L. Wiener and Maxwell T. Will will chair the drive for the Grosse Pointe and Detroit east side area and the Grosse Ile and western Wayne county area, respectively.

ECCLESTONE SAID the present home for boys, at Trumbull and Michigan, was renovated two years ago by experts and a new and larger home to house 24 boys and a more complete staff was recommended. Planning began after the recommendations were approved by the board of St. Peter's.

The Rt. Rev. Richard S. Emrich, bishop of Michigan, and the Rt. Rev. Archie H. Crowley, suffragan bishop of Michigan are chairman and vice-president of the board. Ecclestone said his committee will welcome contributions for a chapel, dormitory or special rooms at the new home.
