**Fred W. Johnson**  
 A long-time resident of Birmingham and first president of the former Birmingham National Bank, Fred W. Johnson, 77, N. Adams and Big Beaver, died at Ford Hospital Sunday. He had been confined there after a heart attack.

Services were held Wednesday morning at 11 o'clock at Bell Chapel of William E. Hamilton Funeral Home, with Rev. A. F. Bunkel, pastor of Birmingham M.E. Church, officiating. Cremation was at White Chapel Memorial Cemetery.

Mr. Johnson had retired from the Detroit firm of Johnson-Larsen & Co., mechanical and heating engineers, in 1942 and was a past president of the Mechanical Contractors Association in Wayne County.

WHEN THE ORIGINAL First National Bank of Birmingham was flooded during the 1933 depression, Mr. Johnson and several other local citizens spearheaded the formation of Birmingham National Bank, of which he served for several years as president. Several years ago it merged with Detroit Bank & Trust Co.

Born in Ohio, Mr. Johnson lived in Detroit for 16 years prior to coming here in 1925 with his family. He was a member of Detroit Commandery No. 2, Knights Templar, Birmingham Lodge No. 44, P.O.A.M., Birmingham's Hill Club, Detroit Recreational Club, Oakland Hills Country Club and the American Society of Heating & Ventilating Engineers.

HE HAD been active in numerous local community activities, including them his personal and often financial aid.

His wife, Carrie L., who died six years ago, likewise was a leader in Birmingham organizations, as a member of the Birmingham Society of Women Painters, Birmingham Musicians, and a Community House board.

During Mr. Johnson's years when Detroit was expanding rapidly, he worked with and enjoyed the friendship of such men as William Knudsen, R. E. Olds, Ed Gray and Henry Ford.

Survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Eric E. Sommer (Nancy), 684 Madison; a son, Fred Lakemond, 1140 Lake Park, both in Birmingham; a brother, C. Clyde Johnson, Detroit; and four grandchildren.
