A total of 118 secondary school teachers and 69 school administrators have been awarded fellowships.

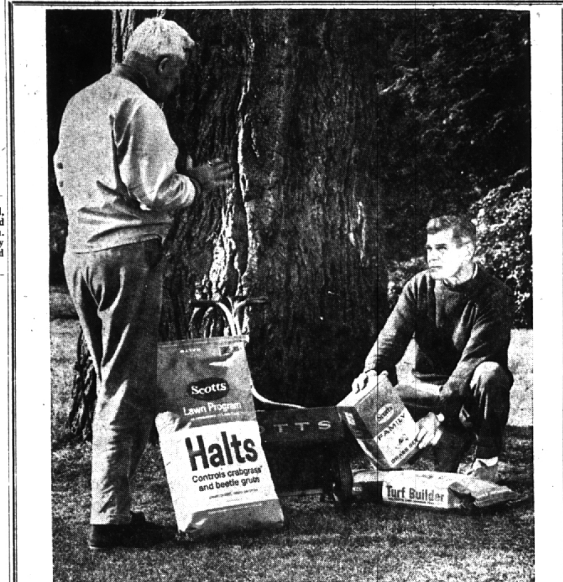

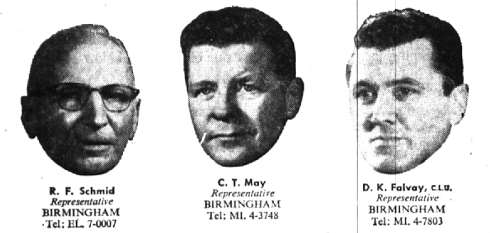
